Training Notes/Talking Points

Etiquette Reminders

- Identify yourself by name to the student- Don't play guess who
- Tell them when you're going to touch them
- Address them by name
- Use color and visual language at normal
- Use clear location words- "The ball is to your right," instead of, "The ball is over there."

Teaching Strategies

- Real objects
- Multisensory activities
- Hand-under-hand
- Systematic introduction to concepts in context
- Descriptive/meaningful language
