Braille Signature

So I'm going to try to demonstrate how to do his signature using Braille cells. So if I want to write your name, Jamey. I'm going to start at four. Go down to five. Down to six. And over two three. From three, I'm going to drag the pen to the right. Over to the cell to the right to three. For the A, I'm going to go up to 2, over 2, five, down to six. Back over to three. Back to six. Back up to five. And over to three, to the cell to the right. Not the prettiest. Kind of square looking. Then from cell three, I'm going to go up to two.

I know it's really hard to explain what a hump looks like. So kind of at an angle over to five. Down to 6. To the cell to the right over to 2. I don't know if this is what I said to you in the email. Down to six. You see I have J A M. And then I'm going to go over to the right. Up to, you could do it like one of two ways. You can drag the pen to the right to the cell to the right and up to two. Down to 3. Over to six. Up to five. And then like I guess like a dropped cell. Down the low with a curve.

And there we go, we've got Jamey. And then move that skill over to the smaller Braille cell. So we kind of do it quicker. You can watch the motion. You can either go up to two. Just really doesn't matter how pretty you wanted to be. I'd practice and then you can describe in the cells. You want to move over to the smaller cell so that the signature gets smaller and smaller as you're practicing.
